


FREE TO GOOD HOME



RECIPE

FRUIT SLICE - GREAT SNACK OR "LUNCH BOX' SLICE

<u>Ingredients</u>

- 500 g mixed dried fruit
- 2 tablespoons honey or golden syrup
- 1/2 cup soft brown sugar
- 1 cup self raising flour
- 15 g butter or margarine
- 2/3 cup (159 g) ricotta cheese
- 30 g desiccated coconut or flaked almonds



Method

- Preheat oven to 160 C.
- Melt butter or margarine, honey and sugar in saucepan or microwave
- Add ricotta. Mix well. Add fruits, nuts and flour to form a stiff mixture. Pat evenly into baking tray, 30 x 25 x 2.5 cm.
- Sprinkle over coconut or almonds. Bake for 15-20 minutes until slice is cooked and golden brown.
 Mark into square while still warm. Cool and store.



SCAM WATCH

June 2019 - Fake Tax Debt Scam via WhatsApp



The ATO advise there has been an increase in scammers using WhatsApp to impersonate the ATO. Current reports indicate the scam is the latest twist to the fake tax debt scam where scammers issue a pre-recorded voice message to your phone demanding immediate payment of a tax debt and threatening immediate arrest. In addition to requesting payment via unusual methods, the scammers may also ask call recipients to send a photo of their driver's licence, passport or other identity credential via WhatsApp. This may result in far reaching identity compromise for victims.

The ATO does not have a profile on WhatsApp and will never engage with you on this platform.

Never give out any sensitive personal identifying information unless you can independently verify the identity of the person or organisation you are providing it to.

Know your tax affairs - you can log into ATO online services through myGov to check your tax affairs at any time, or you can contact your tax agent or the ATO via an independently sourced number.

Cyber criminals can also use vulnerabilities in apps such as WhatsApp to access your phone or device. The Australian Cyber Security Centre (ACSC) is currently advising users of WhatsApp to update your app to apply the latest security updates and set your phone and device/s to auto update.

If you receive an ATO impersonation scam phone call or text message, and have not paid or provided sensitive personal identifying information to the scammer, you can report the scam online.

Scam victims who have paid or provided sensitive personal identifying information to a scammer can call 1800 008 540. This number can also be used to verify if an interaction with the ATO is legitimate.

QUIZ ANSWERS

- 1. Plastic bags can't be recycled if placed in your yellow lid bin because they are a "soft plastic", which means they can become tangled in sorting machinery and cause breakdowns. They can also contaminate other waste which hinders the recycling of other items. Most supermarkets have special bins for plastic bag collection. From here they are taken away for recycling, so best to drop them off there.
- 2. Any plastic which doesn't "scrunch" such as buckets, water bottles and plant pots are fine to recycle, but soft ones are not. The only thing holding back the recycling of rigid plastic is metal, which is often contained within products like children's toys.
- 3. Newspapers, magazines and paper all go in the recycling bin. But make sure they're not ripped into tiny pieces. Anything smaller than the palm of your hand can cause huge problems for recycling factories because they fall through the sorting machines and contaminate other recyclable items.
- 4. Disposable coffee cups are lined with a waterproof plastic called polyethylene which makes them non-recyclable and a contaminant. On top of that, these cups release methane gas in landfill. So, in short, a non-disposable cup is your best choice! Meat trays should not be put in the yellow lid recycling bin please put them in the red lid bin.
- 5. You might have thought that was a trick question, but the answer is no, of course you can't. But we included it because some councils have been dealing with mounds of nappies thrown in the recycling bin.
- 6. Plastic lids are mostly made of a different material and when recycling plastics, all different types must be separated for processing. Bottles containing goods like milk, orange juice and soft drink can all be recycled but the tops of them can't because they're so small they clog up the recycling machines.
- 7. There are limited options for recycling textiles and clothing. You're better off putting old clothes you don't want in a charity bin rather than contaminating it by putting in with your household recyclables to eventually be taken to landfill.
- 8. Aerosols are considered hazardous waste and need to be taken to one of the facilities where the public can safely drop off their hazardous waste nearest to LG is the Recycling Centre at Balcatta, 238 Balcatta Road, Balcatta. Alternatively, you can drop them off in the office and Tina will drop them off when we have a 'collection'.
